Listening, the Foundation for Prayer and Share

Listening is the very **foundation** on which we are to **BUILD** our **Kairos Communities**. Let us build our foundations on the **ROCK which is Christ our Lord** and not on lose sand.

Kairos is all about **CONTINUING MINISTRY** and at the **HEART** of our ongoing Christian Walk are events that REQUIRE us to be a **GOOD LISTENER**, **especially for PRAYER & SHARE**.

Anybody know what the motto of Kairos is?

LISTEN, LISTEN, LOVE, LOVE......This talk on Spiritual Listening is about **BOTH!**

There are **TWO Parts** to LISTENING: **ACTIVE** Listening and **SPIRITUAL** Listening.

1. ACTIVE LISTENING

How many of us would rather talk than listen?

For MOST people LISTENING is one of the **MOST DIFFICULT** skills and so in the beginning we need to be **VERY INTENTIONAL** (ACTIVE) and **Practice** until it slowly becomes easier.

God Created us with ONE mouth and TWO ears. Maybe we should LISTEN twice as much as we TALK.

Here are some **REASONS** why Listening can be **so difficult**:

- We are not really interested in the opinions of others and prefer to steer the conversation back to ourselves.
- We Listen to RESPOND instead of Listening to UNDERSTAND.
- We have Many DISTRACTIONS: Satan uses others around us while we are trying to listen. Satan uses Our OWN minds to saturate our thoughts away from what is being shared.
- Being JUDGEMENTAL filters out some of what we are actually hearing, which results in wanting to moralize or preach as a response.
- We try to fix by giving premature advice or offering cheap consolation.

So, to **SUMMARIZE** the Active Listening part, we **NEED TO BE <u>PRESENT</u> IN THE MOMENT** and **NOT Listen to RESPOND** but instead **Listen to FULLY UNDERSTAND.**

2. SPIRITUAL LISTENING

There are many aspects to Spiritual Listening.

Why do you think we repeat the words in the Kairos motto of LISTEN, LISTEN, LOVE LOVE?

In fact, LISTENING is an ACT of Agape Love!

We begin as we **Listen** to what our **friend** is saying, and we **ALSO Listen** to what our **LORD** is **telling** us about our friend. We **Love our LORD** and He in turn **pours out His Love to us** so that we can **SHARE IT** with our friend.

We cannot give away what we don't have. Freely receive our LORD'S Agape Love but do what Jesus did and pass it on. Living Water FLOWS, stagnant water quickly goes bad, be the 'CHANNEL' between the Lord and our Friend and we too will be 'REFRESHED'.

Here are some **ways** in which we can **practice** the Spiritual Listening part:

- Listen with our Heart ask the Holy Spirit to come into our heart, He is often called Wise
 Counsellor, Comforter or Advocate.
- Humble ourselves and place other people above our own need to be heard.
- **Be patient** and **wait** until both our friend and our Lord have spoken.
- Listen using our EYES: Our vision and being able to FOCUS on our friend can tell us just as much about him/her as hearing what he/she is saying or not saying. Remember in the ACTION talk, we learned to "Make a Friend and Be a Friend" to form a friendship relationship. Doing this will allow us to immediately spot when a friend is DOWN or Filled with JOY or PEACE. During our weekly Prayer & Share meetings, our activity is both PRAYER & SHARE and PRAYER & CARE, depending on our grouping brothers/sisters being UP (praying for others) or DOWN (needing prayer).

To become a **Good Listener** takes **time** and **lots of practice**. The **more** we intentionally **do it**, the **easier** it becomes, at least, in <u>my experience</u>. We may find that one of our brothers has the 'GOD-GIVEN' **Spiritual GIFT of DISCERNMENT.** As the **Body-of-Christ**, allow this brother to use his/her gift to <u>bring</u> the needs of THE CHURCH to our attention.

Wonderful things happen when we learn to **REALLY Listen** to another human being, such as:

- We **feel valued** by someone else.
- We **feel less lonely**, as we feel like we **belong** and have a **bond** with others.
- We GROW to become better disciples of Jesus by opening His perfect Gift of GRACE and accepting His LOVE, and this helps our self-worth.
- We are able to express our feelings and not bottle them up we all need a 'release valve'.
- We realize that we have more in common with others than differences.
- We are supported and can provide support and PRAYERS as we live in COMMUNITY.

We have the **honor** of **witnessing** our LORD at **Work**, let us pay attention. Remember to LISTEN and LOVE so that **we see the OPPORTUNITIES** that our **Lord puts in front of us**. **The Harvest is plentiful, but the Workers are few.**
